Peer Networks' Journey

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Background

Farleigh Hospice is a registered charity, based in Chelmsford, Essex, which provides hospice care to people affected by life-limiting illnesses across mid Essex. The organisation also has a chain of retail stores across the county.

With approximately 44% of the annual running costs being funded by the local NHS, the hospice relies on the support and goodwill of the local mid Essex community to contribute to the over £16,500 it costs to provide the services each day.

Having a team of 800+ volunteers, meant that the Global Pandemic had a major effect on the availability of volunteers during lockdown. As non-essential retail was closed, all 30 of the retail staff were furloughed. With a major decline in income from both retail and donations, the hospice faced significantly increased costs to purchase Covid-safe PPE and additional cleaning services. Notwithstanding, there was an increase in service users (residents) altogether having a major impact on cashflow.

How Peer Networks helped

Debbie De Boltz is Fundraising Manager and manages a team to bring in income from members of the public and the private sector, to sustain sources to deliver the hospice care, free of charge. Debbie felt that joining Peer Networks would give her insight into the pressures faced by other businesses (and potentially those that might donate to Farleigh). Through Peer Networks, Debbie was able to identify problems that potential private sector supporters were facing. She discovered that like Farleigh, they also had teams working remotely, staff challenges with mental health, juggling home school and other family members working from home.

Some Peer Networks members' businesses are entering teams for the Farleigh golf day and participating in the £50 challenge.
